

Our attendance this week has been hit by a number of Covid absences. Hopefully we will start to get back to normal next week!

HEAD TEACHER'S MESSAGE:

Next week we are looking forward to our postponed visit down to Broomley to watch the Jack and the Beanstalk panto. There will be separate performances for the Broomley and Whittonstall children, with cleaning in between the shows. Please see further information in the main part of the newsletter.

We have had a number of covid cases in school this week and have notified those parents whose children have been identified as close contacts with information on daily lateral flow testing. The symptoms displayed so far have been headaches, vomiting and aches and pains, so we ask parents to be as vigilant as possible if your child is feeling unwell. A flow chart was sent out by Parentmail this week to help calculate the isolation period following a positive test result.

If anyone has any of the main symptoms of COVID-19, they are strongly advised to take a PCR test, not an LFD test. If someone with symptoms has already taken an LFD test for any reason and the result is positive, they do not need to take a follow-up PCR test. Please at this time can you remain vigilant and if your child displays these symptoms we ask if you could book a PCR test and not be reliant on LFTs if you receive a negative result.

Up until now, primary school aged children have not been asked to take lateral flow tests. However, in order to reduce the spread of infection, the government now recommends that anyone aged 5 years and over who is a close contact of someone with COVID-19 takes daily lateral flow tests for 7 days.

While this guidance is advisory, we are grateful for your help in encouraging your child with testing which will help to keep pupils and staff safe by preventing further spread within school, whilst reducing disruption to your child's education.

LFD tests for children can be ordered online for home delivery at www.gov.uk/order coronavirus-rapid-lateral-flow-tests or they can be collected from a local pharmacy.

We are aware that some children having to isolate due to the virus, may feel well enough to engage with remote learning. Please be aware that there is no expectation for children who are ill to complete work as the most important thing is for them to recover from the illness. Class teachers will therefore continue to publish timetables and resource sheets on the google classroom platform. Please do not hesitate to get in touch with school if you require support with technology or resources.
