




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Our overall attendance this week was

HEAD TEACHER'S MESSAGE: We have ended the week with sunshine and celebrations, as the children have been learning and thinking about the Queen's life and role during her long reign. The children have worked so hard on their fantastic crowns and we are looking forward to a grand parade at the end of the day for any parents and carers on the yard to see. Thank you all for your support helping the children to make these. Remember the cake stall at the end of the day too - there are some wonderful bakes to choose from.

The children took part in an assembly today about NSPCC Numbers day, which is helping to raise awareness of this amazing charity. The children then took part in some special maths activities back in class.

Over the last few terms, it has been difficult due to the Covid pandemic and self isolation rules, to maintain our usual high levels of attendance in school and it is important that we work together to try to ensure that the children do not miss any more learning time than is absolutely necessary. Arriving at school on time enables the children to get settled and ensures they are ready to start their learning promptly and we very much appreciate your continued help and support with this.

Any children arriving after 9am will continue to enter school through the main front door. However, over the next week or so, we will be introducing a new electronic sign in system at the school office for all visitors, staff and late arrivals. Any child arriving late, or being collected early will need to be signed in or out by their parent or carer and a reason recorded. This will help us to have an accurate record of visitors and staff and will enable the recording systems for pupil absence in school to be as up to date as possible.

We really do appreciate your efforts to get the children into school on time and ready to start their lessons. Thank you for working with us to make the most of every learning opportunity for the children each day.


