Well done everyone for a fantastic attendance record this week.

HEAD TEACHER'S MESSAGE TO THE CHILDREN:

I hope that you all enjoyed a restful half term break and managed to get some time to spend doing the things that you enjoy with friends and family.

At the beginning of the week we received notification from Northumberland County Council regarding additional COVID-19 control measures in schools. The information states that there has been a large increase in the number of children and young people in Northumberland testing positive for COVID-19 and the highest case rates are in school age children. This is leading to spread of COVID-19 within families and into older age groups. Whilst this does not enforce a large amount of changes for our school, we have re-evaluated the activities prepared for this half term in line with; wearing face coverings in communal areas, reduce mixing between year groups and classes as far as possible and to carefully consider whether large events should continue.

We will continue with all the activities we have planned but we will not be permitting mass gatherings into school. This will affect our Christmas plays which will now be recorded and offered on DVD as well as being live streamed, rather than parents coming into school. Staff have now re-introduced mask wearing in communal areas in school and continue with our timetable which includes distancing between EYFS, KS1 and KS2 when it is possible. This week we received our CO2 monitors in school which will be installed in classrooms and communal areas. These will help us quickly identify areas where ventilation is not adequate to allow us to

The situation is on-going and evaluated on a daily basis yet we are hoping with these additional measures if circumstances do change this will be a minimum distribution to the children.


