#### HEAD TEACHER'S MESSAGE:

We have made it to the final week of term and I'm sure that you are all looking forward to breaking up for Christmas and spending some time with family and friends.

Although we haven't been able to host audiences, the Christmas performances have all gone really well. I hope that you will enjoy viewing them with your children and families. The confidence and performances of the children have been wonderful. The DVDs will be available to collect from school in January.

I would like to say a huge thank you to all of the staff who have helped put the Christmas performances together for our children. There is always so much work that goes into these behind the scenes and I'm sure that the children really appreciate all you have done.

The recent rapid spread of COVID and the emergence of the Omicron variant has underlined that the decision not to host audiences for Christmas shows was the right thing to do. Our intention is to try and limit any spread of the virus to enable our children, staff and families to have a normal Christmas without the need to isolate with positive cases. We have also tried to schedule some of the events that we would normally have to maintain the magic of Christmas in school. I am pleased to report that cases in school are still very low when compared with the local community and other local schools. I am expecting a full return to school in January as the Government have made it very clear (and rightly so in my opinion) that schools should remain open. Headteachers do not have the jurisdiction

to make decisions about school closures and any decisions of this nature are taken on the recommendation of Public Health England. In some cases, it is staff absence that has forced these decisions and whilst this is a hugely challenging situation, we have managed this effectively to this point with minimal disruption to our pupils.

Despite the ongoing challenges this term, I have been proud of what we have achieved. We have managed to operate some of our school visits that broaden the educational experience for our children and have kept the content of their curriculum as rich as possible.

I would like to thank you all for your support during the course of the year and particularly this term. It has again been a year like none of us have experienced before and this doesn't look like changing soon. We will continue to adapt and adjust to the situation and make decisions based on the best interests of our children, staff and families.

Have a wonderful Christmas break and a successful New Year and I look forward to seeing you all again on 5th January 2022!
