Queens Platinum Jubilee Celebrations Friday 4th February:

On Sunday 6th of February the country will be celebrating the official milestone of Queen Elizabeth II's reign of 70 years. There are some exciting plans afoot for celebrations to mark this involving both school and community over the coming months, including a joint project with the school, church and the Whittonstall community.

To mark this the children will be learning about the Queen's reign over the last 70 years in school next Friday 4th of February.

<u>Design Your Own Crown Competition:</u> To mark this special occasion the children are asked to design and make their own crown at home to wear on the day. There will be a prize for the most imaginative crown for each year group. There will be a crown procession at school pick up time so parents can see all the fantastic creations.
