



PARENT GOVERNOR ELECTIONS: We have an opening at both Broomley and Whittonstall for a parent academy governor. There may also be additional committee meetings for areas such as property or financial decisions etc.

If we receive more than one nomination, then we will hold a ballot for parents to vote on their preferred candidate. Each candidate would need to submit an election statement at

Next Wednesday is World Maths Day and to celebrate this the children will be performing some special investigations into endangered animals in their classes. Each class will look at a different animal and their work will then be displayed in school.

<u>1950's DANCE CLUB FOR YEARS 2,3 & 4:</u> As part of our Queen's Platinum Jubilee celebrations we have been meeting with Whittonstall Community Group to co-ordinate events.

One of the new Community Group members is a dance teacher who has offered to teach some of the children some 1950's themed dances. She would attend school to take lessons every week, so if your child is interested they would have to commit to attending regularly. Due to space restrictions lessons will have to be held in the church hall after school one night. (possibly a Monday.) This will be confirmed once we have details of the number of children interested in taking part.
