We are having our final dress rehearsals before the film crew arrives on Tuesday to film our Christmas performances. As you will be aware, we have decided not to host audiences again this year for this and other Christmas events such as the Christingle service. We have received further correspondence from NCC this week, which reiterates that sadly parents and carers should not be in school for our Christmas events; a copy of the letter is attached. 
Save the Children - Christmas Jumper Day

Jack and the Beanstalk Panto:

If you have a child in Reception, Class 2 or Class 3 please could you ensure you have completed the google form to give permission for your child to attend the panto at Broomley next Wednesday - <u>Jack and the Beanstalk Panto</u>. If you have already completed the form you will have received a confirmation email from google forms. Thank you to all the parents who have already paid a voluntary contribution of £8.50 for the

pantomime. If anyone else would like to make a contribution, this can be done through parentmail or by sending cash into school. We appreciate your help with this - all contributions will be used to cover the cost of bringing the pantomime into school. We are extremely grateful to the Parish Council as the cost of transport is being covered by a grant they made to school, helping to keep costs to a minimum.

<u>CIF Bid letters of support</u>: We have previously applied to a Government scheme called the 'Condition Improvement Fund' (CIF) which allows schools to apply for capital funding. The priority for the fund is to address significant building condition need, keeping education provider buildings safe and in good working order. Mrs Barker is planning on re-applying for the CIF Bid linked to extending classroom space and providing additional toilet facilities for our school. It would be much appreciated if any parents would like to email in a letter of support (admin@whittonstall.northumberland.sch.uk) for our bid, stating how you think these improvements would enhance our school environment and help with the children's learning. Thank you in advance for your support.

<u>Covid Symptoms and PCR testing</u>: Just a reminder that with the new variant of Covid circulating the rules around PCR testing has again tightened. The advice we now have from Northumberland County Council is that any children who have any symptoms of Covid should book a PCR test and remain out of school until a negative result has been confirmed.
