HEAD TEACHER'S MESSAGE:

Hello and a warm welcome back to school for the Summer Term. I hope that you had an enjoyable break and were able to enjoy some family time and some exciting days out. We are also lucky to have a lovely long weekend with the Bank Holiday on Monday, so we will look forward to seeing the children back in school on Tuesday.

The Summer Term is always a busy one and we are scheduling a range of events as we return to normality. However, this does have to be balanced with our most important job, which is teaching and learning and making sure that our children make good progress. Please keep a close eye on the calendar for upcoming events such as jubilee celebrations, sports day, summer fair and summer disco. We are really looking forward to seeing parents at all these wonderful events for the children.

Prior to the Easter break, I sent out the latest Government COVID-19 requirements. The main guidance is set here in the next steps for <u>living with longerCOVID-19</u> in England from Friday 1 April. In addition, schools have now received updated guidance from the DfE outlining the changes to measures and guidance for managing COVID-19 in education and childcare settings from today. Therefore, children who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can come back to school, when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend. The guidance continues that regular asymptomatic testing is no longer required; however, free COVID-19 tests will continue to be available for specific groups, including eligible patients and NHS staff, after the universal testing offer ended on Friday 1 April. A personal thank you to those who have taken the time to offer such kind words and support regarding the news this week of my departure at the end of this academic year. I am really looking forward to spending as much time as possible with all the children this summer term and ensuring a smooth transition for both the children and staff for when a new Executive Head Teacher is appointed.

PARENT GOVERNOR VACANCY: Just a reminder that today is the closing date to apply to become a Parent Academy Governor on the Whittonstall First School Local Governing Body. All Parent Academy Governors must have children at the school (as parent or carer) and must also be elected by the parents and carers of pupils at the school. The period of office for service as a Parent Academy Governor is 4 years and a Parent Academy Governor would not be obliged to resign from office if his/her child leaves the school, they would be able to remain in office until the expiry of the term of office. The role of Academy

Governor can be hugely rewarding in terms of the impact that you can have on the outcomes for children as well as the opportunity to learn and develop new skills that can be of benefit to you beyond the school community.
